## **A THANKSGIVING MESSAGE FROM PASTOR JOHN NIEMAN**

To God's People at Zion:

As you continue in the call-process, once again I have the opportunity to serve for a while as your transitional pastor. I look forward to being with you again.

With a national Day of Thanksgiving soon approaching, I share a few thoughts about thankfulness, and about how one goes about saying, "thank you" to God. In looking up the Hebrew words for thankfulness I was surprised to find that there are none, none which refer to the feeling of being thankful. Instead, all of the words that have to do with thankfulness are action words, words that say such things as, singing a prayer of thanks, presenting an offering of gratitude—but as far as just feeling thankful, there are none.

And how fitting that is! For, even amid the worst of times, even amid the times when the feeling of thankfulness may seem a far reach, God's people have puzzled their neighbors by displaying a true joy, by singing praises, or making joyful noises, or presenting an offering. They heard Paul singing in his jail cell in the dark of night, and amid times of war and famine the prophet Habbakuk was heard singing: "though the fig tree does not blossom, nor fruit be on the vine, though the produce of the olive fail, and fields yield no food, though the flock be cut off from the fold, and there be no herd in the stalls, yet I will rejoice in the Lord, I will joy in the God of my salvation."

And so, in good times and in difficult times, we can do the thankful actions of singing praises, of speaking prayers of thanks, of giving our time and abilities in service, and, of bringing our thank-offerings. Praise be to God!

Dear Friends in Christ,

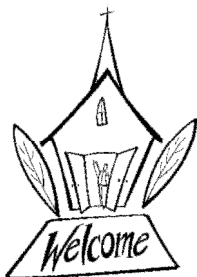
